## **OUR ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2023**

2023 was characterized by a lot of activities at our campus and in the communities where we engaged with more than 3,000 clientele.

Our primary stakeholders continue to be farmer groups, students, institutions, interns and marginalized and orphaned children.

## We were able to accomplish most of our strategic objectives as follows:

- **1. Food sovereignty:** Over 3000 farmers were reached and taught on the principles of sustainable food production with the goal of increasing food production at the household level.
- **2. Seed sovereignty:** G-BIACK farmers engaged themselves in an active exchange of a diversity of indigenous seeds as part of the movement towards seeds sovereignty. Besides our own, Several seed banks have been established in the communities which are managed by the farmers groups.
- **3. Environmental conservation:** In order to strengthen respect for the environment in the target communities, G-BIACK established 5 tree nurseries and collaborated with the department of wildlife in planting over 3000 trees at the Kilimambogo national park.
- **4. Women and youth programmes:** More than 2000 women and youth were given practical skills in GROW BIOINTENSIVE, textiles, cooking and baking and computer literacy skills
- **5. Centre Development:** Our farmers campus which is constantly in development attracted more than 1000 farmers who underwent training taught by our competent staff trainers.
- **6. Collaboration and networking:** G-BIACK increased its impact through collaboration and networking with different organizations that saw more farmers reached and trained in GROW BIOINTENSIVE.

We hope and pray that 2024 will equally be a good year for us and we shall reach more farmers to help our communities become food secure.
