Incorporating boys in the empowerment programme

In order to improve youth involvement in agricultural production, attention should be given to the factors leading to youth migration to urban areas. In addition, the economic constraints facing youth in agriculture (lack of credit, weak profitability, capacity constraint, etc) should be examined. However, the only alternative that is remaining is for the Youths to be trained on modern ways of agriculture immediately after high school. This is the only way that will help the youths to become self-reliant immediately after they graduate from school. We can only reduce youth unemployment in Kenya through sustainable agriculture, if we want do things right.

The GROW BIOINTENSIVE Agriculture Centre of Kenya has been empowering young women who complete high school to gain skills in GROW BIOINTENSIVE agriculture, a form of agriculture that has proved to be very sustainable in terms of food productivity. From July 2022, G-BIACK has also included boys as a pilot programme. These youths are trained in Agriculture, Cooking and baking skill, textiles, and computer basic literacy skills.
