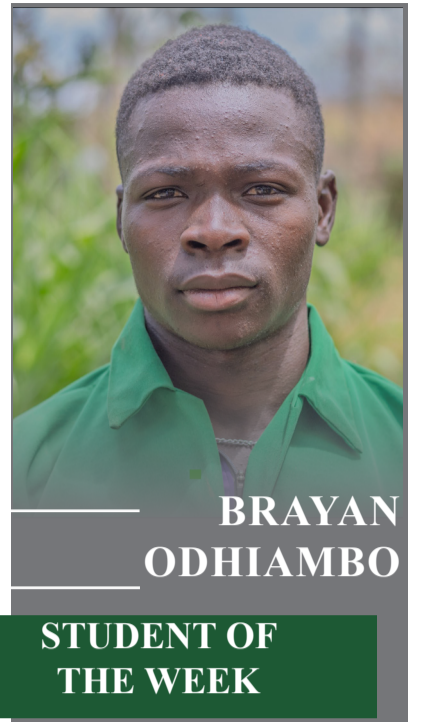

Farming Through the Challenges of Heavy Clay Soils

At the GROW BIOINTENSIVE Agriculture Center of Kenya (G-BiACK), the rainy season is both a blessing and a challenge. While the rains support crop growth, our heavy clay soils hold too much water, becoming sticky and difficult to work. This can delay planting and affect young crops if water collects on the surface. Careful soil management, such as raised beds and adding organic matter, helps farmers cope with these conditions and keep crops growing well.
